Colorado's Protection & Advocacy System

2012 ANNUAL REPORT

In FY 2012, The Legal Center provided direct service to 1,228 individuals statewide. Of these, 450 individuals received direct legal representation from The Legal Center. For those clients' cases that were closed with a resolution, the outcome was in the clients' favor 86% of the time.

The Legal Center operates eight Protection and Advocacy Programs:

- Protection and Advocacy for Developmental Disabilities (PADD)
- Protection and Advocacy for Individuals with Mental Illness (PAIMI)
- Protection and Advocacy for Individual Rights (PAIR)
- Protection and Advocacy for Assistive Technology (PAAT)
- Protection and Advocacy for Beneficiaries of Social Security (PABSS)
- Protection and Advocacy for Traumatic Brain Injury (PATBI)
- Client Assistance Program (CAP)
- Protection and Advocacy for Voting Accessibility (PAVA)

Across these eight P & A programs, direct service intervention included

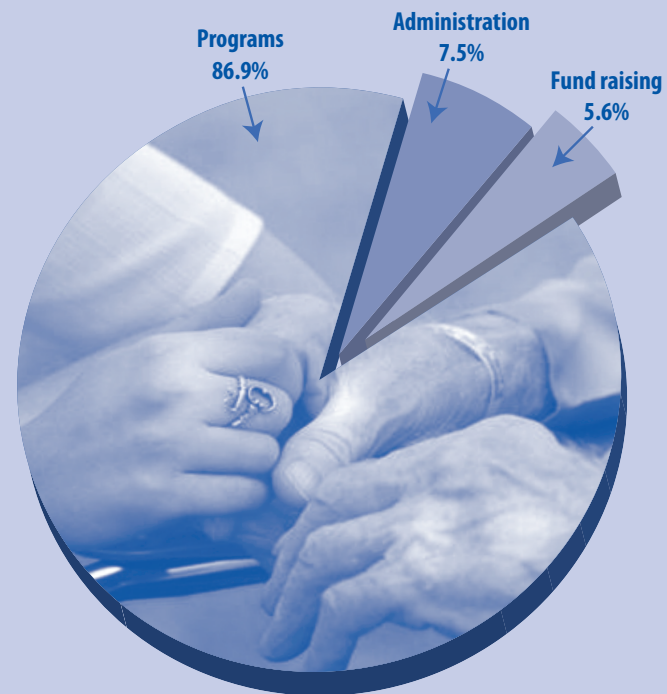
- Education – 305 cases
- Abuse/neglect and other rights violations – 245
- Housing - 191
- Employment – 164
- Access to benefits - 101
- Access to health care - 93
- Rehabilitation services - 54
- Transportation - 9

In addition

- Information and referral was provided to 8,043 callers
- 2,169 copies of our major publications were sold or distributed
- Our web site received 66,373 visits
- Randy Chapman's Ability blog had 17,400 hits
- 2,402 participants attended 57 education/training programs

Two programs for older Americans, The Colorado Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program and the Legal Assistance Developer Program, are administered by The Legal Center under an agreement with the Colorado Department of Human Services and operate in conjunction with the 16 regional Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) to coordinate services statewide. The collective statewide network provided legal services to 4,411 older persons; made 4,383 visits to assisted living residences and 2,832 visits to nursing homes - more than twice the required number of visits; completed 5,177 consultations with individuals; and investigated 3,959 complaints, 73% of which were fully or partially resolved to the satisfaction of the resident.
