The Audio Information Network of Colorado (AINC) is in its 25th year of serving Colorado residents. AINC's mission is to provide audio access to ink print materials not otherwise available to Colorado's blind, visually impaired, and print disabled residents. Services for Individuals with Print Disabilities

In 2015, AINC will celebrate 25 years of providing audio services to help individuals with print disabilities maintain independence and stay connected to their community. A person with any condition that makes it difficult to read is eligible for AINC's free services and equipment. AINC volunteers read and record nearly 100 Colorado newspapers; grocery/discount ads; magazines; and other local publications. Programming is also available in Spanish. Individuals have independent access to programming 24 hours a day, seven days a week. We offer a variety of listening options so an individual can choose what is best for them.

Listening options include:

- Telephone
 - Listen to one of the three regional broadcasts
 - Use the Information-On-Demand menu system to listen to programs at your convenience
- Digital Receiver Regional broadcasts
- Internet Radio Regional broadcasts
- Internet
 - Listen to regional broadcasts
 - Download Podcasts of programs

AINC does not charge listeners for services or equipment. Individuals can complete applications by phone or online. Staff members are always happy to answer your questions and assist with equipment set-up as needed.
