


How to Change Your Guardian(s) or End Your Guardianship

In Colorado, **you have a right to a lawyer to help you change your guardian(s) or end your guardianship**. Below is a flow chart that moves through the legal process of how you can access a lawyer.

Checklist of legal documents that must be submitted to the court for <u>STEP 1</u>:

- JDF 852, Petition for Termination of Guardianship Adult: <u>https://www.coloradojudicial.gov/self-help-and-forms/self-help-forms/petition-termination-guardianship-adult</u>
 - Fill this form out and attach any additional information that helps explain to the court why you no longer need a guardian.
 - You must mail or hand-deliver a copy of **JDF 852** Petition for Termination of Guardianship Adult (and attached information) to all interested persons in the case.
 - After mailing or hand-delivering a copy of **JDF 852** Petition for Termination of Guardianship Adult, fill out the Certificate of Service part of the form.
- □ JDF 854 Order for Termination of Guardianship Adult: <u>https://www.coloradojudicial.gov/self-help-and-forms/self-help-forms/order-termination-guardianship-adult</u>.
 - Fill out the top "caption" part of this form and the court will fill out the rest.
- □ JDF 711 Notice of Hearing: <u>https://www.coloradojudicial.gov/self-help-and-forms/self-help-forms/notice-hearing-probate</u>.
 - Give notice of the hearing date and time to all interested persons by mailing or handdelivering a copy of this form. Fill out the Certificate of Service part of the form before you file it with the court.

Filing Steps:

- □ File **JDF 852** and **JDF 854** with the court.
- □ Contact the court about getting a date for a hearing.
- □ Give notice of the hearing to all interested parties. Fill the Certificate of Service portion of **JDF 711** and file this form with the court too.
- □ There is no filing fee, and the form includes an option to request the appointment of an attorney or Guardian ad Litem (GAL).
