Bipartisan Support Propels Disability Rights Bill Forward; Senate Hearing Set for April 17

Denver, CO — A major legislative effort to protect individuals with disabilities from unnecessary institutionalization passed the Colorado House of Representatives on Wednesday with **overwhelming bipartisan support, in a 60–5 vote**. [House Bill 25-1017](#) now advances to a hearing in front of **Senate Health and Human Services Committee**, currently scheduled for **Thursday, April 17 at 1:30pm**.

The measure embeds in state law key principles from the landmark *Olmstead v. L.C.* Supreme Court decision. HB25-1017 requires public entities to deliver services in the **most integrated, appropriate setting** and directs the state to develop a **comprehensive community integration plan** to better support individuals with disabilities.

"This bill affirms the rights of people with disabilities to live in community-based living instead of being segregated and isolated in institutions." said **Kelly McCullough**, Co-Legal Director of Disability Law Colorado. "The strong bipartisan support underscores Colorado's shared commitment to dignity, autonomy, and inclusion for all."

During Thursday's hearing, lawmakers will hear **firsthand testimony** from **Molly Kirkham**, a disability rights advocate affiliated with **The Arc of Colorado**. Molly brings both lived experience and a personal connection to the issue: her grandmother was institutionalized, and she herself relies on community-based services. Molly will be available for **in-person interviews** following her testimony.

Also available for **virtual interviews** is **Nancy Jensen**, a disability rights advocate and author of *The Girl Who Cried Wolf: A Memoir*. A resident of **Cañon City**, Nancy experienced unjust institutionalization firsthand and has previously testified before Congress about her fight for independence. **Contact Felix Ortiz to schedule an interview with any of the individuals above.**
